## ELEANOR LANCASTER

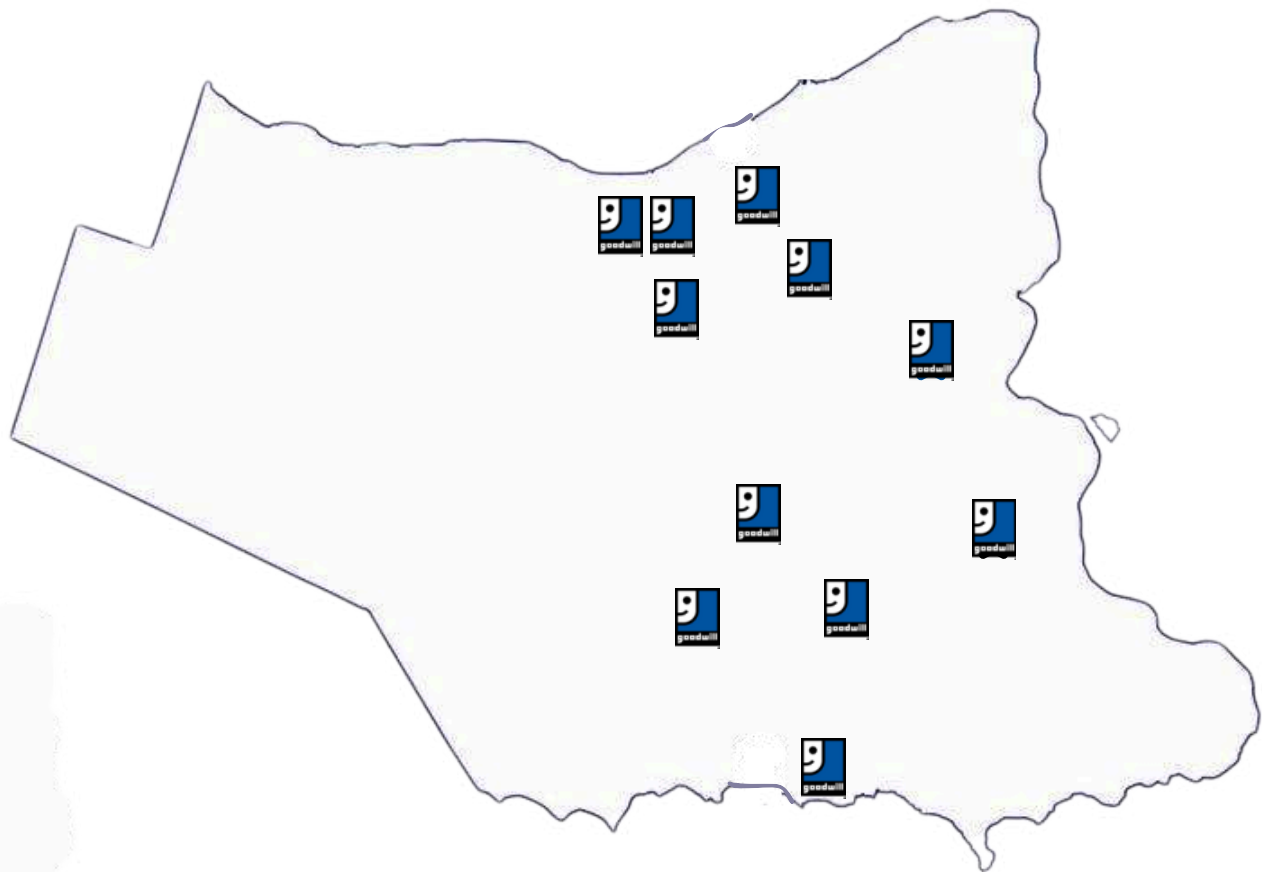
In January 2025, Goodwill Niagara lost a beloved member of our Board of Directors. Eleanor Lancaster was a Board member for 25 years, she helped shape our organization to be a successful one. Eleanor was a teacher, consumer advocate, volunteer, broadcaster, politician and civil servant.

Eleanor was the first female appointed to the Ontario Environmental Assessment Board, serving as Vice Chair. She was a Regional Councillor for Niagara from 1982 to 1991. She was passionate about her community and got involved as much as she could. Over the years, she served on many other boards in Niagara including, Brock University Board of Trustees, Niagara College Board of Governors, The Lincoln County Board of Education, Hotel Dieu Hospital Board, Canadian Henley Rowing Corporation and United Way Campaigns.

One of Eleanor's proudest moments was serving as Board Chair and Campaign Chair for Goodwill Niagara for our \$1.6M Stokes Project. This project revitalized the former Stokes warehouse and created affordable housing for seniors, a community centre that offers office space to agencies in the community as well as a home to our Building Futures programs.

Eleanor Lancaster is sadly missed at Goodwill Niagara and in our community, she left us great memories and an amazing legacy across the Niagara Region.

It is my privilege to present the annual report for the year just ended. As the financial and statistical data clearly show, Goodwill Niagara has had another successful year. We continue to see growth in the number of individuals we serve, as well as increases in revenue.

This success is no accident—it is the result of strong leadership from Karen and the senior management team, and the dedication and positive attitude of all our staff in their daily interactions with clients, shoppers and donors. I also want to acknowledge the commitment of our Board of Directors, whose strategic guidance, advice, and support are invaluable.

While many people associate Goodwill Niagara primarily with our thrift shops, we are proud to be much more than that. Our thrift shops serve three essential purposes:

1. Community Service – They provide a valuable service to the communities we serve.
2. Employment – They offer meaningful employment to approximately 180 individuals.
3. Revenue Generation – They generate the funds that enable us to offer a wide range of programs and services across the region.

Beyond our retail operations, we currently manage two apartment buildings in Niagara that offer affordable housing for seniors—both of which maintain 100% occupancy. We also operate a robust recycling program and a successful workforce development initiative. In addition, we collaborate with other registered charities throughout the region to amplify our impact.

Looking ahead, we have exciting plans for the upcoming fiscal year. A new store is set to open this fall in St. Catharines, and we are actively exploring additional opportunities for expansion across Niagara.

In summary, Goodwill Niagara has had an outstanding year. We are proud of our accomplishments and confident in our ability to continue serving our community with excellence and compassion.

# MESSAGE FROM PRESIDENT & CEO

I would like to extend a heartfelt thank you and my deep appreciation to all staff across the organization for their continued dedication and hard work. I would also like to thank our numerous stakeholders, partners and the community for their dedication and support throughout a transformative and prosperous year.

Over the past year, Goodwill Niagara was able to hire more employees increasing staffing levels from 160 to over 190, reflecting the organization's expansion and commitment to service in the Niagara Region.

The building beautification project at Stokes, our St. Catharines affordable senior apartment building, was completed this past year. The restoration and addition of beautiful stonework by Overbeeke Masonry, helped preserve the integrity and appearance of the historic brownstone building.

The Churchill affordable senior housing building in Welland, underwent a complete exterior renovation by Tip Top Exteriors. The transformation is astounding, and the completed project really enhanced the look of the building far exceeding expectations.

A new retail/donation centre on Vansickle Road in St. Catharines is set to open this fall with additional stores planned across the Niagara region in the coming year. This new location will create 25-30 new jobs in St. Catharines while increasing the community impact in the Niagara community.

Over the past year we worked diligently streamlining assistance programs and aligning with partnering agencies throughout Niagara. The continued delivery of skills training and employment programs in collaboration with local businesses allowed us to reach to more families, offering a hand up, not a handout.

We are proud to say that over 17.3 million pounds of reusable items were diverted from landfills this past year. Our sincere thanks to the community for donating preloved items, helping others give them a new home and contributing to a healthier planet.

Finally, a special thank you to the Board of Directors of Goodwill Niagara for their unwavering support and guidance throughout the year. Their commitment to community, sustainability, and meaningful change is inspiring and impactful.

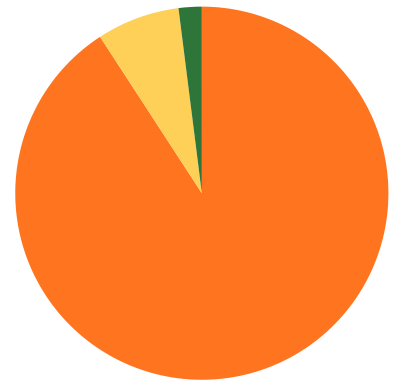

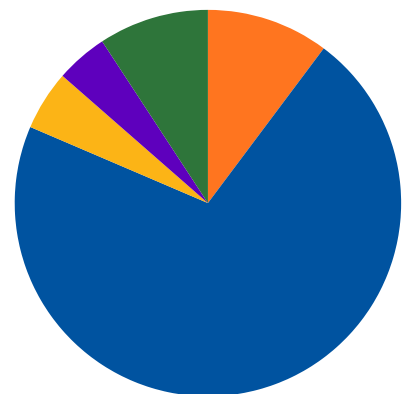

Goodwill Niagara is proud to provide 57 thoughtfully designed one- and two-bedroom apartments for seniors at 36 Page Street in St. Catharines and 1 Churchill Avenue in Welland. These residences prioritize comfort, safety, and accessibility, featuring energy-efficient appliances, security-controlled entryways, elevators, laundry facilities, green spaces, community rooms, and onsite parking.

Our commitment goes beyond housing—we actively invest in the surrounding neighborhoods. Since opening these communities, Goodwill has enhanced the areas with upgraded lighting, landscaping and restored masonry work. These improvements foster safer, more welcoming environments for all residents.

Affordability remains at the heart of our mission. With rents set at one-third of the market rate, seniors can access secure, quality housing while maintaining financial independence and peace of mind.

Through these initiatives, Goodwill Niagara continues to support seniors in living with dignity, stability, and a strong sense of community.

## **Community Development Program**

We are pleased to announce that the Community Development Program has been streamlined to better serve our partnering agencies, as well as the individuals and families who rely on it.

This redesign focuses on delivering services more efficiently while upholding the highest standards of confidentiality and dignity. Through this improved approach, we've been able to reach more people and ensure they receive the essential resources they need.

## **Successfully Suited Program**

We are proud to continue offering the Successfully Suited Program, designed to empower individuals by providing professional attire and support for employment and career advancement.

This program ensures that participants have access to appropriate clothing for interviews, job placements, and other professional settings—helping them feel confident and prepared.
